Day 1 Sunday, June 26, 2016

Depart via scheduled air service to Prague, Czech Republic

Day 2 Monday, June 27 Prague (D)

Arrive in Prague

Meet your MCI Tour Manager who will assist the group to awaiting chartered motorcoach for a transfer to the hotel via orientation tour of Prague seeing the Charles Bridge, Old Town Square, the Tyn Church, the Astronomical Clock, and the Jewish Quarter

Mid-afternoon hotel check-in

Evening dinner and overnight

Prague achieved much of its present glory in the 14th century, during the long reign of Charles IV, king of Bohemia and Moravia and Holy Roman Emperor. During the Middle Ages, Prague enjoyed a golden age - a time when Prague was larger than Paris or London! The Hapsburgs also left their artistic and architectural mark. Today, Prague is universally declared one of the most beautiful cities in Europe

Day 3 Tuesday, June 28 Prague (B,L)

Half-day guided tour of Prague includes a visit to Hradcany Castle, including its St. Vitus Cathedral, the Old Royal Palace, the Golden Lane, and the Daliborka Tower

Half-day guided tour of *Musical Prague* including entrance to the Dvorak Museum in Prague. The Museum focuses on collecting, maintaining and displaying documents concerning the Maestro's life and work. Also visit Lobkowitz Palace with its large music archive containing works by over five hundred composers and musicians. The Music Archive is most celebrated for its collection of works by Handel, Mozart, Haydn and Beethoven

Day 6 Friday, July 1 Prague / Vienna (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel
 Transfer to Vienna
 Lunch on own
 Upon approach to the city, stop at the Vienna City Cemetery to visit the graves of Beethoven, Strauss, Brahms, Schubert and the Mozart Memorial
 Orientation tour of Vienna's main attractions and landmarks
 Evening dinner and overnight

Vienna is still considered the music capital of the world. It is a city of refined tastes, grace, style and unmatched artistic accomplishments. For a thousand years, Vienna was the capital of the far-flung Holy Roman and Hapsburg empires. Though its people and ways have changed, Vienna has retained its imperial monuments, not as reminders of past glories, but as living symbols of its present freedom

Day 7 Saturday, July 2 Vienna (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel
 Half-day guided tour of *Historical Vienna* includes the Ringstraße, Imperial Palace, State Opera, Town Hall, Burgkapelle (home of the Vienna Boys Choir), Palace Stables, Strauß Monument, and entrance to Schönbrunn Palace, built by the Hapsburgs in imitation of Versailles
 Lunch on own

 Evening dinner and overnight

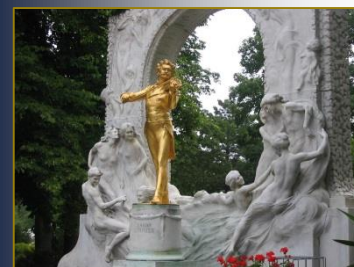
Day 8 Sunday, July 3 Vienna / Melk / Mondsee / Salzburg (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel
 Transfer to Melk to visit the Abbey. The Abbey of Melk which crowns a rocky bluff overlooking the Danube more than 150 ft. above the river, is the apogee of Baroque architecture in Austria
Recital in Melk Abbey
 Lunch on own
 Continue to Mondsee to see St. Michael's Church (site of the *Sound of Music Wedding*)
 Then it is off to Salzburg for dinner and overnight

Salzburg, Mozart's birthplace, is a delight from the first sight of the outline of the Hohensalzburg Fortress, the symbol of the power of the prince-archbishops. The city's picturesque streets with their wrought-iron signs, its spacious squares with sculptured fountains and the noble architecture of its buildings inspired by bishops with a passion for construction, leave memories which linger for years

Day 9 Monday, July 4 Salzburg (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel
 Morning guided tour of Salzburg including Mirabell Palace and Gardens, Mozart Square, the Dom (cathedral), University Church, entrance to the



Mozarthaus (Mozart's birthplace) and a cable car ride up to the Fortress (for an unparalleled view of the city below)

Lunch on own

Evening Farewell Dinner and overnight

Day 10 Tuesday, July 5 Depart for home (B)

Breakfast at the hotel

Transfer to Munich's airport for return flight
